Biography

- Born 1711 in Edinburgh, Scotland
- By age 18 had a nervous breakdown
- A good friend of Benjamin Franklin
- Died 1776 in Scotland
- Hume is regarded by critics as the most important philosopher to have written in the English language. Why?
 - 1.He discovered an original and broad way to cover issues (metaphysics, ethics, etc)
 - 2. He pursued ideas of John Locke, leading to skepticism
 - 3. He formulated a defense of skepticism



Philosophy (major ideas)

We cannot establish the existence of an external, physical world

Since our beliefs are based not on reason but imagination, they cannot be rationally justified The physical world, as philosophers and laymen alike have conceived it, has an existence independent of anyone's awareness of it

Ultimately, nothing can be known

The "real world" lays beyond human's knowledge of it.

Our moral convictions are based on feeling rather than on reason
