

## TF (Coed) Participation Statistics, Specific to 2024

### TF Participation Rates!

When considering the number of track & field athletes relative to the population of the high school, one question presents itself: Which schools had the largest percentage of track & field athletes walking their hallways in this season?

Due to space limitations and in consideration of shifting Classifications, rather than 6A/5A/4A/3A/2A/1A, the public schools are grouped by student population as "Large" (1101+ students; 57 schools on this list), "Medium" (1100-451 students; 48 schools), and "Small" (450-150; 62 schools), and there is a separate list for all "Private Schools" (all sizes down to a minimum population of 300). The reason for the size cutoff is because the smaller the school, the more disproportionate an affect on the statistics per student-athlete relative to the larger schools. Similarly, private schools are separated out into their own category.
